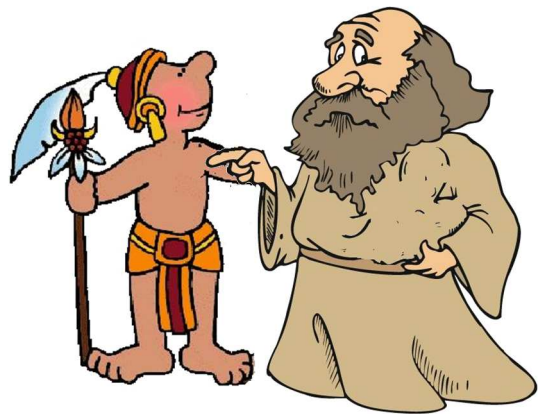


WHAT IS THE AUTHOR'S PURPOSE?
