Biographies: Antoine de Saint-Exupéry



One of the best-known fantasy literary works of the 20th century, <u>The Little Prince</u>, was written by the illustrious French writer Antoine de Saint-Exupéry.

Antoine was born in Lyon, France, on June 29, 1900. He lived with his parents and four siblings. He belonged to a wealthy, aristocratic family and so enjoyed many privileges. His father died when Antoine was only four years old.

Before becoming a famous writer, Antoine studied architecture at the University of Fine Arts in Paris. However, he never finished college. He didn't think he had many talents for drawing, but he drew the illustrations for his most recognized work, <u>The Little Prince</u>.

Antoine worked as a pilot transporting airmail, covering various postal routes, including Toulouse - Dakar. At that time, flying a plane was a dangerous job, and few people wanted such risky work. He created many memories of all his flights, which inspired many of his literary works. The French government awarded him the Legion of Honor medal for his negotiations with Moroccan forces to release fellow airmen who had been taken as prisoners.



During one of his flights in 1935, his plane crashed in the Sahara Desert. He survived the impact with his partner, but they ran out of provisions to eat or drink. Fortunately, they were rescued by a Bedouin a few days later and saved from certain death.

His literary adventures as a writer began when he moved to Argentina. It was there that he wrote his first novel, <u>The Aviator</u>, which was published in a literary magazine.





The Little Prince, his most recognized and famous work, tells the story of a little prince who finds an aviator in the middle of the desert. This little prince comes from asteroid B612 and is devoted to traveling to different places, learning about different characters with different personalities. In the story, the prince analyzes and discovers the vision that adults have of life, which is very different from that of little ones. As the story goes on, you can see the analysis of the different values human beings have, including that of love and friendship.

Some of the most notable phrases in this novel are:

- -What is essential is invisible to the eyes.
- -It is necessary only to ask each one what each one can give.

<u>The Little Prince</u> has been translated into more than 250 dialects and languages. It is found on many lists of most widely read and sold books in the history of literature with more than 100 million copies.

Antoine and his works became so famous that his face appears on the 50-franc bill. This currency was in circulation until the entry of the euro in France in 2002.

In 1975, an asteroid was named Saint-Exupéry in honor of his worldwide recognition.

Even though he is considered one of the best writers of children's literature of the twentieth century, his works are not exclusive to the younger audience, many adults read and enjoy them as well.
