Who founded the American Red Cross?

Clara Barton was born in Massachusetts. She was the youngest of five children, two boys and three girls.

From childhood, she cared for all members of her family, including her dog. Once when she was only 11, her brother fell from the roof of the barn. Clara did not budge from his side. She learned to administer his medicine and did all she could to heal him.

As an adult, she worked as a teacher in a school. During the Civil War, she tended to the sick and wounded on the battlefields. After the war, she dedicated herself to search for missing soldiers.

She founded the American Red Cross and was its first president. Later, Clara traveled the country,

teaching people first aid. Many schools across the country are now named after Clara.
