

Which First Lady lived in the White House when it was burned down by the British in the War of 1812?



Dolley Madison was born on May 20, 1768 in North Carolina. Her parents were were Quaker Virginians. Quakers were a religous society that opposed slavery. Dolley was raised with little

formal education. Dolley grew into a beautiful young lady and married John Todd, Jr., a lawyer, in 1790. Sadly, just three years after marriage, an outbreak of yellow fever killed her husband and her



Not long after her husband's death, U.S. Senator Aaron Burr helped introduce Dolley to James Madison, who was well known for his service to his country including helping to draft the Constitution of the United States. After some persuasion by Martha Washington (George Washington's wife) she married James Madison in 1794 and moved to Virginia with him.

When James Madison was appointed Secretary of State by Thomas Jefferson, they moved to Washington D.C. Because President Jefferson's wife had died, Dolley Madison would play the part of hostess at the White House, organizing dinners, and balls, and other social events.

In 1809, James Madison was elected the fourth President of the United States. Madison served two terms in the White House. During this time, Dolley Madison was admired for her social graces and her role as First Lady. During the War of 1812, British soldiers attacked the capital and burned

down the White House. Dolley saved many important documents and a portrait of George Washington before fleeing from the advancing British army.

James Madison died in 1836. Dolley Madison spent the next years organizing and copying her husbands papers, which she would sell to help pay for her living expenses. Dolley Madison died on July 12, 1849, at the age of 81. She is buried next to her husband, James Madison, at their Montpelier plantation in Virginia.
