







Hurricanes are strong tropical storms that form in the southern Atlantic Ocean, the Caribbean Sea, the Gulf of Mexico, and in the eastern part of the Pacific Ocean. Hurricanes are classified as five categories according to the wind speed, central pressure, and potential damage. While category 3 and higher hurricanes are considered major hurricanes, categories 1 and 2 remain extremely dangerous and deserve your full attention.
