Animals of the World: Mammals

THE LION,





Lions are considered the kings of the savannah. These strong, aggressive creatures are one of the most well-known animals on the entire planet.

Its scientific name is Panthera Leo and belongs to the cat family. They are carnivorous animals, feeding mainly on zebras, buffalos, and gazelles, but also eat other smaller animals. What they eat depends on the animals where they live.



They hunt for food in packs. There can be up to 3 adult males and numerous lionesses with their cubs and can have anywhere from 3 to 40 lions in a pack. The lionesses are in charge of hunting because they are more agile and faster. Also, they

camouflage better in the undergrowth since they do not have the big mane that characterizes the male lion. The males defend the pack's territory and protect the family.

When a lion gets angry and roars, it is so loud it can be heard 8 km away, about 5 miles. They start developing that powerful roar at the age of two.



When lions finish eating, they rest and doze under the shade of trees. They sleep up to 16 hours a day.

An interesting fact is that lions are the only felines that live in packs. Also, it is the second-largest cat behind the tiger.

Lions live in the savannahs and grasslands, but they can be found living in wooded areas at times.

Young lions live with the adults until they are about two years old. Then, they leave the pack and the males look to establish a new pack. When a lion gets old and



loses his strength, he will leave the pack and go far away to die.



Normally, lions have a brown skin color. A few lions have a whitish skin color. The whitish skin color is caused by a genetic mutation. The skin color of lions becomes darker as they age.

The adult male lion is huge, weighing up to 300 kilograms. Lions can live 20 years; but, typically,

they only live 10 to 15 years in the wild.

Because lions have been threatened by human predators, their population is suffering a noticeable decline. Many are now in danger of extinction. This is mainly because of people who hunt them indiscriminately, without considering the consequences this has for the environment. Countries have designated parcels of land as nature reserves and





reservations to protect these animals. It is strictly forbidden to hunt in a nature reserve or on a

reservation. Some species of vulnerable lions have had to be rescued and treated in breeding programs at zoos and reserves to protect them from extinction.

Lions have been a highly prized and revered animal

for their strength, courage, and power throughout history.
