CELEBRATE ST. PATRICK'S DAY

St. Patrick's Day is celebrated on March 17.

This is the day that Saint Patrick died. It is a religious holiday in Ireland. Ireland is an island which is located in northern Europe. It is known as the Emerald Island because it has a climate that encourages the growth of trees and plants.

Leprechauns, or pixies, are another characteristic symbol of the Saint Patrick's holiday. Leprechauns are small, old-looking beings that play pranks and jokes. It is said that they are shoemakers. Before the 20th century, it was possible to see them dressed in a red jacket with silver buttons, red breeches, high blue or brown socks, big black shoes with thick silver buckles, and high top hat. They have a special treasure, a pot full of gold coins.



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It is said that they hide at the end of the rainbows. If you catch one, you can ask him to give you his treasure. But you'll have to keep your eyes fixed on him; if you look the other way, he will escape and run away so fast that you will not be able to catch him.



St. Patrick's Day is celebrated in many parts of the world, especially in English-speaking countries. Some cities have parades where different groups and bands stroll around the city dressed in their best suits. Most of them



wear the color green in honor of the saint. The biggest parade is in New York City, where more than 150,000 people come to enjoy it. The city of



Chicago dyes the river green to celebrate the date. It is a special dye that is temporary and is not toxic, so it does not damage the fauna in the river. The green color lasts for a short time until the party is over.

The cuisine is different for this holiday. The menu for St. Patrick's Day consists of corned beef with cabbage, black pudding, sausages, and mashed potatoes. This was the typical food of Americans of Irish origin in the

19th century. People enjoy drinks that are tinted green, in honor of the festival.
