no French section is considered peninsular.

The border of the Iberian Peninsula has usually been set in the mountain range called the Pyrenees.





Almost the entire surface of the peninsula is occupied by two countries, Spain and Portugal. There are also other small territories like the country of Andorra, and the British territory of Gibraltar. In 2011, the Iberian Peninsula had a population of 53,888,353.



The ancient Greeks called it Iberia, and for the Romans, the territory that lies beyond the Pyrenees was called Hispania.

It is known that several different towns populated the Iberian Peninsula, such as Cantabrian, Basque, Asturian, Galician, Celtiberian, Lusitanian, Carpenters, Bastetans, Oretanos, Vetones, and others.
