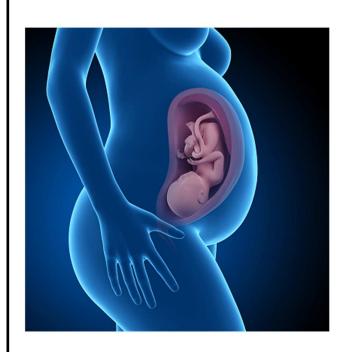

The Navel



The belly button, or navel, is a small part of your body on your abdomen. All humans have a belly button, whether young or old. It is a reminder that at some point you were connected to your mother. This is because your body was attached to your mothers with an umbilical cord.

The umbilical cord usually measures about 50 centimeters and is tube-shaped. It may be a little longer or shorter in different people.

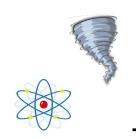
Just after you are born, the doctors cut the umbilical cord. and after a few days a small scar stays on your abdomen.

When the umbilical cord is cut at birth, a small part of it stays on you for a few days until it dries up and falls off. The navel is the scar that remains on your abdomen where the umbilical cord was.



Each person has a belly button with a different shape. Some navels stick out, like a button. Others go in, like a small crease or hole. There are no pretty or ugly belly buttons, they are all different.







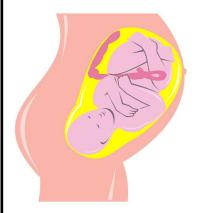






The truth is that after birth, the navel is useless, it is not a vital organ, and has no important function. It is just a nice reminder that during a brief time in our lives it was the bond providing nutrition between you and your mother.





Because of the umbilical cord, the baby could feed while in the womb. It allowed the baby to receive the nutrients and oxygen needed for it to grow inside its mother. Once the baby leaves its mother's womb after delivery, it no longer needs this means of food transportation, so the doctors cuts the cord.

Some people adorn their navels with metal gadgets or earrings, called piercings. They only have a purely aesthetic function.

To maintain proper hygiene in the navel, it is advisable to wash it with soap and water while you bathe and when finished dry it well with a towel.
