

Linking Verbs



Linking verbs link the subject with a word that describes it.

They are <u>not</u> action words.

ALWAYS A LINKING VERB

am	is	smell	look	taste
be	were	seem	grow	get
was	are	feel	turn	stay

SOMETIMES
A LINKING
VERB

Some linking verbs are <u>not</u> always a linking verb because they can be used as an action word in some sentences.

Here is an easy way to check if it is a linking verb or not.

Substitute the linking verb being used with words that are ALWAYS linking verbs, such as am, is, are, was, been, or were. If the sentence still makes sense then it is a linking verb. See the example.

The cookies smell good. (I can substitute <u>are</u> and the sentence still makes sense.)

I love to smell the flowers. (The sentence doesn't make when substituting are.)
