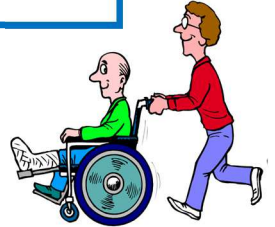

1. He will push the wheelchair for Grandpa.

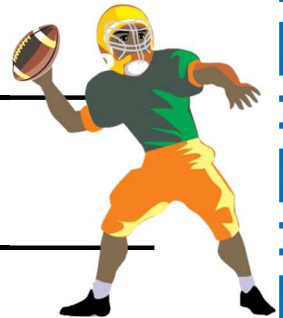

3. My brother will dig worms for fishing.

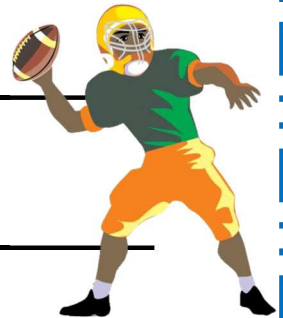
**My brother will have dug worms for fishing.**

**Meg will have seen the doctor when she gets home.**

7. Birds will fly south for the winter.

**Birds will have flown south for the winter.**

8. Mike will wash his car.

**Mike will have washed his car.**

**They will have gone on a field trip next week.**

10. Mary will watch the Spanish dancers.

**Mary will have watched the Spanish dancers.**
